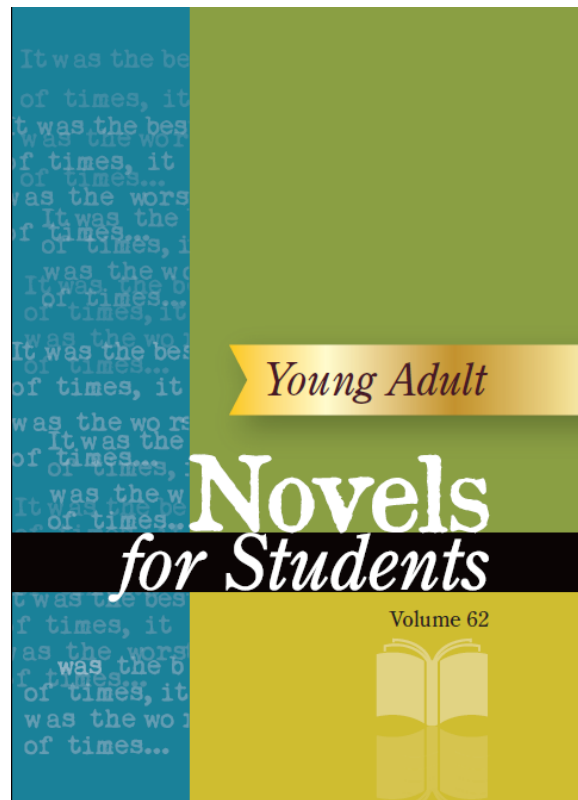
UNIQUE LITERATURE FOR YOUNG ADULTS

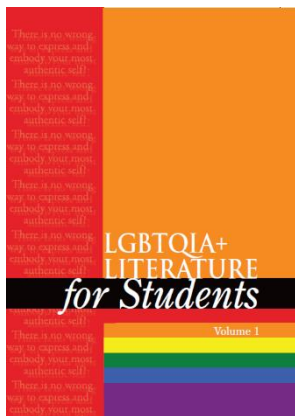

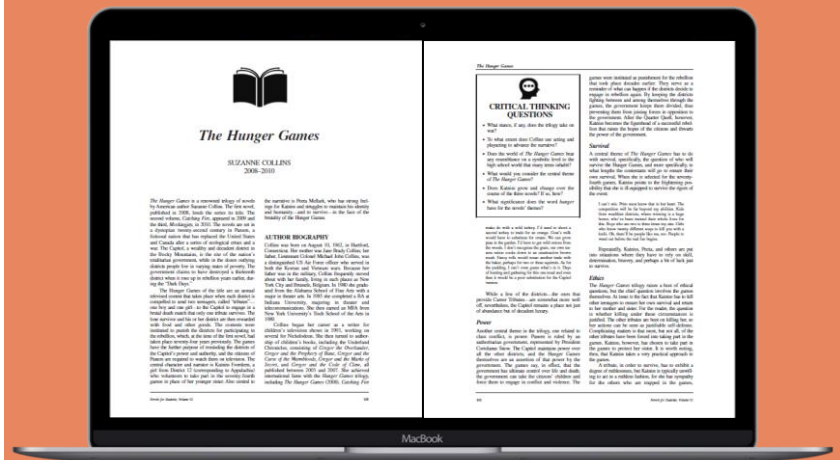

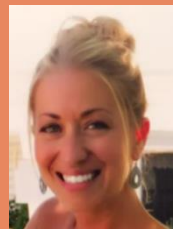
